
The prophet Joel spoke of a day when multitudes will be called to walk through the valley of decision. Are you following the gospel so you are ready and prepared for that day?

Our Church Council did not meet in July but sent in reports as usual. Here is a summary of those reports.

- 1. Congregational Care Committee (Marie Milton and Debby Long)continues to meet the needs of our church family through "caravan visits," cheer boxes, and providing assistance for specific needs and transportation. If you know of a need, please contact Marie Milton or Debby Long.
- 2. Evangelism is re-starting with a new leader, (Wendy Boswell). She is calling a meeting to talk and discuss ways we can reach out to welcome visitors to our church. She also hopes to re-start "Kids Night Out" very soon. If you're interested in joining this team, please contact Wendy.
- 3. Methodist Daycare (Angie Dillon and Cindy Ranson) is making some policy changes regarding the way they handle fees for staff members with children. They're also working on new ways to handle past-due accounts and assist families in need. MDC is looking for ways to survive the hardship that increased minimum wage is causing for the operations of MDC and for the families we serve. They are working on refreshing and preserving the mulch in the playground. The mask mandate has been lifted for vaccinated Prayer Ministry (Nathan and Brenda Putney) Our prayer warriors continue to be vigilant and ready to pray for the needs of our church. Thanks to the 90 people on the list who lift up needs that are reported through prayerchainmumc@yahoo.com. The prayer ushers serve on Sunday mornings as well. We thank the Lord for his answers to prayer this month.

The Finance Committee will begin working on the 2022 Spending Plan at our September meeting. The finalized Spending Plan will be submitted for approval to Church Council at their October meeting so that it can be presented at Charge Conference in November. All Committee Chairs are asked to submit to Nancy, no later than **August 23**<sup>rd</sup>, all budget requests to be considered at that meeting. If there is no request submitted for a line item, it will be at the discretion of the Finance Committee the budgeted amount for that line item. The Annual Conference Banquet of the Evangelical Fellowship of Virginia:

As many of you might know, the Virginia Annual Conference meeting this year was virtual rather than in person. So we missed once again the fellowship and interaction of seeing friends and colleagues who serve in other districts. Another thing we missed was the breakfasts and banquets groups hold during an Annual Conference.

One of those groups, the Evangelical Fellowship of Virginia wanted to try to have their Annual Conference banquet after the Covid restrictions were lifted in July. They wanted to find a central location where people could come together and learn more about the state of our connection together and what the future might hold for us as United Methodists.

So, when the Rev. John Bright called me and asked me if Memorial would be able to have them come to our church on August 14th, I checked the calendar, and didn't see any conflicts to hosting them on our schedule.

#### Dylan's Garden

Have you ever had a lapse in reaching a goal?

The manifestation of our hurts, hang-ups, or harmful habits can be depression, addiction, codependency, anger, or other unhealthy actions reflected in our behaviors. At CR, we work to understand our actions with the goal of changing our unwanted activities. Sounds easy, right!

No matter the plan and the strength of our dedication, we can lapse in staying on plan. Dylan's Garden is a picture of this process. We designed a garden from the garage, across the front, and down the side of the house. The scheme for this area: till, eliminate the weeds, put down black garden cloth, cover with mulch and finally fill with rhododendrons, azaleas, and vinca. A very doable plan – right?

Think about when we engage in making a change in our life. I will ... stop drinking - never lose my temper again - always be positive - only eat healthy foods - stop gossiping - avoid

people-pleasing. Sounds easy. The plan looks doable, we tell ourselves, yup I can do this. But here is where the work begins.

We tilled, laid the paper, and spread two truckloads of delivered mulch. All with the help of our great-nephew, Dylan. What seemed like an easy project actually turned into a weekslong hot, sweaty endeavor. We didn't anticipate the effort to till soil hardened by months of construction or how hot we'd be laying the cloth. Lastly, moving the mulch wasn't the fun vacation activity planned. Even though the project was only half done, the beds looked professionally prepared. We thought the hard work was over. But, no, our toils had just begun.

We located, hauled, and planted 20 rhododendrons and 8 azaleas bushes. The vinca, ordered online, arrived looking like dead sticks. Meticulously following the instructions, the vinca was planted. None survived. The decision was made to harvest vinca from Great-grandfather Samuel's gravesite. The following spring,

we dug up and transplanted the vinca. Also, a harder undertaking than originally thought.

Success, we accomplished our task, or have we? We all have harmful practices, obsessions, or a lifestyle we'd like to change. We set a plan and make progress on reaching the goal. However, when have we achieved the goal?

Dylan's garden now included bushes and equal-spaced ground cover. Far from finished, we moved to the next phase -- weeds.

Recently, when yanking weeds from the beds, the effort reminded me of dealing with relapses in our attempts to change. We plot our procedures for change. We make progress toward our goals. At one point, it seems our tactics work, and we'll reach the goal post. But then, we slip and do what we vowed we'd never do again. The weeds magically reappear.

A lapse doesn't mean all the progress made is gone. Weeds, like a lapse, appear to destroy all the work done to create a beautiful garden. However, pulling the unwanted growth allows the desired flora to flourish again. As we march on in making changes, remember what Paul said in Romans 7:15, "I do not understand what I do. For what I want to do, I do not do, but what I hate, I do." Relapse is part of the journey of many steps in the course of change.

Remember to celebrate the small successes and be willing to do course corrections when needed!
