Pastor's Note...

The Bible says for each of us to put on Christ. But how do we do that? One of the plainest ways and most obvious way is how we pursue the desires of our heart.

The Holy Scriptures describe a difference between the way of the righteous and the way of the unrighteous. The Apostle Paul distinguishes that even further when he differentiates between the works of the flesh and the fruit of the Holy Spirit.

We want to continue to help you clarify that even further during June. How? We want to take the 9 common desires all humans share as highlighted by the fruit of the Spirit and provide a clear contrast between how grace pursues these desires and how sin pursues them.

As I was trying to understand this concept of clarity I read this from the Digital Photo Mentor at digitalphotomentor.com.

What that means is that Clarity looks for differences in tones between one thing that is dark, up against something that is light – an edge. When it finds that tonal difference it enhances it, and makes it greater – so in the grayscale image each step up in tone has only the outside of the block showing increased contrast.

So, my job, if I do it correctly, will be to help you draw that edge in your life between the Spirit and the flesh, between pleasing God and governing and suiting ourselves.

So, take an extra dose of humility as we look at these things together. Draw near to God so all you do originates or happens because of Him. Why do you want to do that? Because God brings to an end everything He does not begin.

So, remember. For Jesus to be the Finisher of your faith He also needs to be its Author.

Sue Eggleston called the meeting to order at 7:02 pm.

Cindy Ranson led devotions....Matthew 15:18

April 2021 minutes were approved.

Kinckle Robinson (Finance)...Finances are doing well. Building loan has been paid off!!! In only 9 years!!! We will let congregation know with a One-Call message, and will mail a letter. A celebration is being planned tentatively for July 4th.

Sue Eggleston (CC Chair)...Need to pray for someone to lead Evangelism Committee. Post Covid re-entry group will be formed to make decisions for the local church...this consists of the pastor, lay leader, other key leaders, trustee, and people who can bring new thoughts to the table.

Debby Long & Marie Milton (Congregational Care)...Have delivered 4 cheer boxes to church members. Recognized oldest mother on Mother's Day with a gift card to Granny Bees. Will do the same for oldest father on Father's Day. Continue to call our shut-in members often.

Nathan & Brenda Putney (Prayer)...Held prayer meetings on 5/3 and 5/17 in the sanctuary. Everyone encouraged to join in these bi-weekly meetings. Praying for our Sunday School, revival in the church, and for those who have needs for the prayers of the church.

Angie Dillon & Cindy Ranson (Day Care)...MDC doing great! Outdoor equipment has been purchased. Looking at re-doing the mulch and fixing the gravel in play areas. Rate increases have gone into effect and workers have received their pay increase. Nancy will be looking to end the mask mandate for children and vaccinated employees. MDC will honor it's employees who are graduating high school.

Harry White (P & G)...Church pew cushions are being cleaned and will be put back in the sanctuary. We will repair fascia damage on the front of the sanctuary. Pressure washing the front of the church, re-glazing window panes, and painting will take place. A leaking outdoor faucet has been repaired. HVAC repair in the day care has been completed. Playground shade sails have been hung. Repairs have been made to some exterior lights. Freezer in Legacy Hall has died, new freezer options are being looked at in price range of around \$1500. Making sure the ice maker in day care is being serviced regularly.

Sue Waddell (Missions)...\$3055 has been donated for Guatemala. 273 stuffed animals have been collected and delivered to GFTW.

Sheila Webb & Cindy Ranson (Worship)...HB Communion will resume first Sunday of June!

Norman Ramsey (Pastor)...Giving thanks for church council, the generous giving of the church, the support we give mission projects, and that we are able to live stream the service into Legacy Hall. Praying for mask mandate to end in day care, resuming prayer ushers and HB communion, preaching without a face covering starting May 30th, for all graduates, for annual conference on June 18-19, that people are brought to Christ and into the fellowship of Memorial UMC, and the 4th Sunday in June will be used to thank members of the Healthy Church Team and dedicate to service the Post covid Re-entry team.

Mitch Eggleston closed in prayer.

Sue Eggleston adjourned the meeting at 8:03 pm.

It is with great JOY and DELIGHT that we announce to you this day that our building loan with Farmers Bank for “Legacy Hall” and “The Connector” have been paid in full! **PRAISE the LORD!**

So what’s next? **Stewardship**. We need to take care of what we have. Many of us are in the holy habit of giving “extra” (beyond our tithe to the general budget) for the building fund. It is our hope that many will continue that holy habit but instead contribute towards the **Building Maintenance Fund** so that we can keep all of our properties in good shape, being good stewards of all that God has entrusted to us.

Here is a 5-year Capital Project Outline:

1. New flooring in the entire day care space, including all rooms, bathrooms, and kitchen.
2. Renovate all the bathrooms in the day care area (4 total).
3. New lighting in the hallways in the day care area.
4. New ceilings in the day care area.
5. Upgrade the lighting in the Sanctuary.
6. Painting in Legacy Hall.
7. Additional lighting on the Virginia Avenue side of the parking lot.
8. Painting exterior front of the main church building.

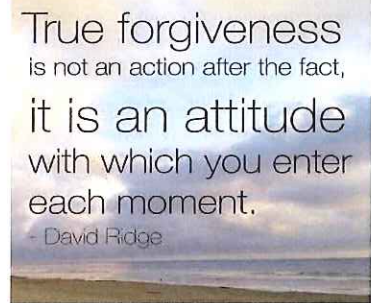
And then there’s every day maintenance, breakdowns, unexpected problems....

FORGIVE US OUR TRESPASSES,
AS WE FORGIVE THOSE WHO TRESPASS AGAINST US.
MATTHEW 6:12



How many times have you heard advice that is easy to give but hard to take? Forgiveness is one of those topics. Over and over again we are told to forgive, in fact we are told to forgive 70 times 7.

Easy advice to give, not necessarily easy to personally implement.

Recently at C/R we talked about many examples of forgiveness:

At confessed killer of 60 women Gary Ridgway's sentencing, repeatedly the victims' families lashed out in unimaginable grief. However, **Robert Rule**, the father of teenage victim Linda Jane Rule, words were: "Mr. Ridgway, there are people here that hate you. I'm not one of them. You've made it difficult to live up to what I believe, and that is what God says to do, and that's to forgive. You are forgiven, sir."

Armed, Charles Roberts walked into an Amish schoolhouse. After releasing the boys and the adult women, Roberts killed 5 young girls and himself. His rationale; he wanted to exact revenge from God for the death of his newborn daughter. In forgiveness, **the Amish community** attended Robert's funeral, comforting his widow and offering financial support.

The shooting of Officer **Steven McDonald** by Shavod Jones left Steven paralyzed and requiring a respirator to breathe. McDonald forgiveness of Shavod included communicating with Jones in prison and planning a ministry to promote forgiveness and non-violence upon Jones' release.

Marion Hedges suffered a severe brain injury after two teenage boys dropped a shopping cart on her head from a fourth-story parking garage. In spite of her resulting disabilities, Hedges expresses her forgiveness toward the two boys, "I wish them well. I do, because I feel very sorry for them."

Pierce O'Farrill was one of the 58 people James Eagan Holmes wounded during a shooting spree. Twelve people lost their lives that night. However, Pierce chose compassion, "Of course, I forgive him with all my heart. When I saw him in his hearing, I felt nothing but sorrow for him."

Renee Napier and Phillip and Mary Dickson forgave the drunk driver who killed their two daughters.

Do you know **Corrie Ten Boom's** story? During WWII, her family worked to save the lives of Jewish neighbors. The Nazi SS arrested Corrie and her family based on an informant's actions. Corrie's entire family and the all the women Corrie's age were killed in the concentration camp. After the war, while preaching on forgiveness, Corrie came face to face with a former guard. She tells about her internal struggle, telling God she could not, would not forgive this man! Only if God gave her the power to forgive could she shake the man's hand. God did! Corrie tells about being filled with relief, joy and peace upon shaking his hand.

Inmaculee Ilibagiza grew up in Rwandan. During the civil war, her entire family was killed. She recounts that her human nature desired revenge. However, she chose to forgive and turn away from the bitter feelings of rage destroying her. Though not easy, she was determined to let forgiveness, rather than hate, rule her life. Eventually, like Corrie Ten Boom, she met one of the murderers face-to-face and told him directly that she forgave him.

In the Bible, **Jesus** tells the story of a servant that is forgiven much but can't forgive a friend a little.

Why are we told to forgive?

It is a necessary step in finding the peace that passes all understanding.

These vignettes are brief pictures of resulting forgiveness and not the path to reaching forgiveness. For many, it is a struggle to understand the need and reach the point of forgiveness. However, the reward for forgiveness is great.

At C/R you will find a group of friends who have walked through many struggles in life and will support you in your journey. to healing.

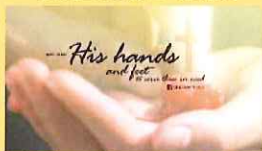

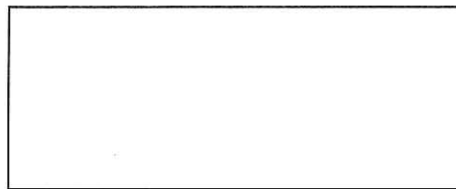
