Pastor's Note...

The Bible says for each of us to put on Christ. But how do we do that? One of the plainest ways and most obvious way is how we pursue the desires of our heart.

The Holy Scriptures describe a difference between the way of the righteous and the way of the unrighteous. The Apostle Paul distinguishes that even further when he differentiates between the works of the flesh and the fruit of the Holy Spirit.

We want to help clarify that even further during the months of May and June. How? We want to take the 9 common desires all humans share as highlighted by the fruit of the Spirit and provide a clear contrast between how grace pursues these desires and how sin pursues them.

As I was trying to understand this concept of clarity I read this from the Digital Photo Mentor at digitalphotomentor.com.

So, my job, if I do it correctly, will be to help you draw that edge in your life between the Spirit and the flesh, between pleasing God and governing and suiting ourselves.

What that means is that Clarity looks for differences in tones between one thing that is dark, up against something that is light – an edge. When it finds that tonal difference it enhances it, and makes it greater – so in the grayscale image each step up in tone has only the outside of the block showing increased contrast.

So, take an extra dose of humility as we look at these things together. Draw near to God so all you do originates or happens because of Him. Why do you want to do that? Because God brings to an end everything He does not begin.

So, remember. For Jesus to be the Finisher of your faith He also needs to be its Author.

Do you know the importance of hope?

In 1957, a study put wild rats in a beaker to swim; they lasted 17 minutes.

A second group was rescued after only 16 minutes. Placed in the container a second time, the rescued rats swam for 36 hours. Why the difference?

Why could the second group now swim for a day and a half? The scientists concluded the second group had learned the hope of being

saved. In the first case, the rats hadn't experienced this new environment and had no expertise in escaping. So, they merely gave up. Once the rats experienced being removed safely from the water, they learned a chance, a hope, existed for reaching dry land. This knowledge gave them the hope to continue.

We also show the effect of hope. People who lose hope have a much lower chance of surviving cancer. Hope reduces a chemical that fights breast cancer. Yes, feeling hopeful actually changes your brain chemistry. Without realizing it, when you feel hopeful, chemicals are pumped into your brain that block pain and accelerates healing. These chemicals are neurochemicals called endorphins and encephalin, which have the same effect as morphine.

All of these studies underscore the part hope plays in our lives. Being in a state of hopelessness can strip us of our energy and motivation to continue. But finding hope can provide the strength to endure far longer than we expect.

At C/R, we base our look for a life renewed on hope.

Higher Power: God can do for us what we have never been able to do for ourselves.

Openness to change: With God's help, we allow our trials to make us better, not bitter. *Power to change:* God's power is enough to change us and our situation.

We can't change on our own, but we can ask God to take charge.

Expect to change: Expect God to bring healing; it is one of his promises.





If there are 4 volunteers, that would put you on the schedule once a month. With 8 volunteers, that would be once every other month. The more the merrier.


