
Pastor's Note...

Sue Eggleston called the meeting to order at 7:03 pm.

Debby Long led devotions....from Mornings with Jesus, Psalm 16.

Minutes from August 2021 were approved.

Kinckle Robinson (Finance)...Giving is down, spending is down. Finance committee would like Stewardship Committee to emphasize the importance of tithing in October.

Sue Eggleston (CC Chair)...Would like to plan a leadership retreat for 2022. Newsletter deadline is 9/20. Legacy door code has been changed, old code will be deleted on October 1st. Casey will be holding a Feeding Appomattox meeting 9/16. November 17th is charge conference, church council will meet 11/16. November 21st will be a Thanksgiving service with a guest speaker. Lay Leadership meetings are now in progress to plan for 2022. New directory, made at the church with emailed selfies or groupies is being considered.

Tom Hall (Trustees)...Lease runs out on copy machine next month. We have proposals and will decide later this month who to go with.

Rodney Deaner (UMM)...reminded that Ladies Night Out is this Friday at Crown Sterling 6:30 pm.

Nathan and Brenda Putney (Prayer)...Prayer services were held 8/9 and 8/23. Prayer Ushers are available at the end of each worship service or via phone/email.

Sue Waddell (Missions)...In the coming months will be requesting Christmas Shoe Boxes, collecting donations for using parking lot on RR Day for supporting hurricane relief through UMCOR, helping with Feeding Appomattox, and Christmas Cards for troops.

Angie Dillon and Cindy Ranson (Daycare)...Toddler gate will be divided to make room for babies learning to walk. No covid among children! Nancy seeking more workers, adult and teen.

Debby Long and Marie Milton (Congregational Care)...Thanks everyone who is contributing to the Cheer boxes. Will start delivering a devotional book to church family members who are grieving loss of a family member. Transportation team is still busy.

Sheila Webb and Cindy Ranson (Worship)...HB Communion at Babcock Manor has been suspended due to covid. Still no update on delivery of mics. Prayer and Praise cards will be put at sanctuary entrances and ushers will collect for Norman. Acolytes will return in October. Tori requested additional items for service need to be emailed to the service builder. Brenda thanked all those who have been attending prayer meetings. Bryan says choir is unable to meet yet, but handbells are still practicing. Children have started staying in worship services until after scripture is read, then heading to Children's Church. Homecoming service for 11/21 has been cancelled, we will still have a guest speaker that Sunday. Resumption of Holy Grounds and new Worship schedule is temporarily on hold.

Debby Long (Super Seniors)...Picnic is planned at Peggy Lawson's house on 9/25 from 4-7. Gene Williams will provide music.

Harry White (Property & Grounds)...July's water bill was double the previous month, looking for leaks. Legacy door code has been changed. Bohannon HVAC made 2 service calls this month, problems with AC were taken care of. Legacy kitchen freezer delivery has been pushed back to Dec-Jan. New water cooler for childrens SS hallway will cost \$729 and about \$250 for installation. Planning to store all the furnace filters in a central location and set a schedule for replacement. Have received a quote from Lynchburg Fence Co. for Daycare to add a small fenced-in area for toddlers.

Bobby Waddell (SPRC)...Planning to meet the first week of October.

Donna Deaner and Leeann Robinson (Education)...Last Sunday kids were promoted to their new SS classes. A new Women's Bible study will start 9/16, Sermon on the Mount by Jen Wilkin.....currently 14 women participating. Norm Ramsey (Pastor)...Working with Finance and SPRC to figure out how to best meet staffing needs of the church. Encouraged folks to attend charge conference. Pray for Warsaw UMC, they lost their pastor suddenly in his sleep. October is Stewardship month!

Adventure Sunday Month “VBS” on Mystery Island

Vacation Bible School took on a new format this year! During the month of August, the children enjoyed a day of VBS each Sunday morning. The children’s Sunday School area was decorated in a jungle theme for our adventure on Mystery Island where we discovered the endless attributes of God.

Each Sunday morning we began our VBS program in worship through song and the introduction of bible memory verses. Together, we discovered God’s attributes by using Creature Features, Treasure Maps, and the Bible. We then broke into two different groups and headed to Lighthouse Lessons, Missions and Crafts.

In Lighthouse Lessons, the kids learned from Paul, Jonah, Isaiah, Jesus, and David that God is GREAT, ALMIGHTY, RULER, EMMANUEL, AND TRUSTWORTHY. During Mission Moments, the children “traveled” around the world to Haiti, Guatemala, Nepal, Romania and the United States where they discovered that everyone is a treasure to God. They learned about other children living in poverty and how they can make a difference. And that the Bible says that giving generously to the poor is really giving generously to God. (Prov.19:17) In that spirit, the children collected \$76.09 in offering to send to our missionary partners, Chris and Paula McNutt with Passion4Guatemala. In Crafts, the children decorated their very own Adventure Vests to wear as they explored Mystery Island and to take home as a reminder of all that they had learned. In Elementary School Crafts, they decorated Island Scene Dioramas with reminders of God’ beautiful creation and the VBS Theme Verse: “I will extol you, my God and King, and bless your name forever and ever.” (Psalm 145:1) Some children included a lighthouse in their diorama, a symbol of Jesus, the Light of the World.

Vacation Bible School on Mystery Island was a great success even in this unconventional format!



When Was The Last Time You Truly Relied On God?

For example, when Shadrach, Meshach, and Abednego respond to the inquiry of a furious King Nebuchadnezzar. "We do not need to defend ourselves before you in this matter. If we are thrown into the blazing furnace, the God we serve can deliver us from it, and he will deliver us from Your Majesty's hand. But even if he does not, we want you to know, Your Majesty, that we will not serve your gods." Or, Daniel's retort as he sat locked in a lion's den, "My God sent his angel, and He shut the mouths of the lions."

Or, are you more of the self-reliant, I can do it myself type?

Great minds in our world tell us the best path is self-reliance. Socrates supports the concept that self-reliance is a virtue, "To find yourself, think for yourself." Napoleon Bonaparte's guidance is, "If you want a thing done well, do it yourself." Ralph Waldo Emerson advises us, "Nothing can bring you peace but yourself." In her NY Times bestseller Educated, Tara Westover opines, "The odds are better if you rely only on yourself."

Have you struggled with an issue and told yourself you can "fix it." Just to find, you don't have the strength to force the change in your life?

At CR, we all have issues that range from depression, shame, perfectionism, grief, co-dependency ... to many other struggles. But we use a different approach from the worldly view of self-reliance as the best path to change. Addressing our concerns and finding a life renewed is not based on self-power but on letting go and letting God. The mantra of the *Little Engine That Could* is changed to... I know I can't, I know He can, I'll let Him.

Instead of saying, Lord, I don't know how I will do this, we say, Lord, I can't wait to see how you'll do this. Letting go and letting God is much easier than using the white-knuckle approach of self-reliance.
